#### 4. Mitacs project & timelines -

- Project Updates
  - Scoping review extracted 162 papers, excluded another dozen more, going to visualize that and send to others soon. Looks more like islands as opposed to a pathway so could conceptualize movement along journey through vehicle use, i.e., using a plane or ferry or canoe to get between "islands".
  - Completed two focus groups so far: starting with 5 and going to be coming back to them in the fall for follow-up.
  - Finishing wireframe for January 2024 and then looking to build app in 2024 but will require funding.
- McMaster Compendium of Leadership Programs







- Developed a value network map internally covering the 4 A's (accessibility, affordability, adaptability, and alignment of program).
- o Proof of concept to see if those metrics works.

#### Expert Interviews

- Met with the Australia's Health Education and Training Institute regarding this
  project. They are developing a number of leader success profiles which will be
  replicated for other roles, with an emphasis on skills and capabilities.
- Two interviews with UK's Faculty of Medical Leadership and Management who have an app called "Navigator". For junior physicians; 4 domains with 200 pieces of content. Costed them 75KGBP for the technical part with a total budget of 165KGBP with 800GBP per month to keep it updated. <a href="https://www.fmlm.ac.uk/navigator">https://www.fmlm.ac.uk/navigator</a>
- Pallium Canada has an app focused on their palliative care competencies framework, beginning to build it out now. Budget was 85KCAD for the development with an estimate of 15-20KCAD per year. Have 25 resources mapped with many more needing evaluation and a committee doing so. Took 14 months to develop, with pilot test soon. Will share the link when available.
- International Collaborators
  - Kirsten Armit (UK), David Sweeney (Australia), and Peter Angood (US) have agreed to be our international experts.
